We are pleased to introduce our soapstone carving program for grades K-6 and Art 7-12. Soapstone carving is a very engaging and interactive way of allowing kids to represent study material, a unit theme, or an element that is vital to their community or classroom's culture. Hosted by PEAKS Campus Facilitators, students will learn about Girardi Creek and the *threatened* status fish that spawn within it. Students will have a chance to carve their own fish sculpture after exploring the significance of Girardi Creek and the surrounding waters of the Livingstone Range. Be prepared to get messy!

• **Time of year:** Activities dependent on season.
